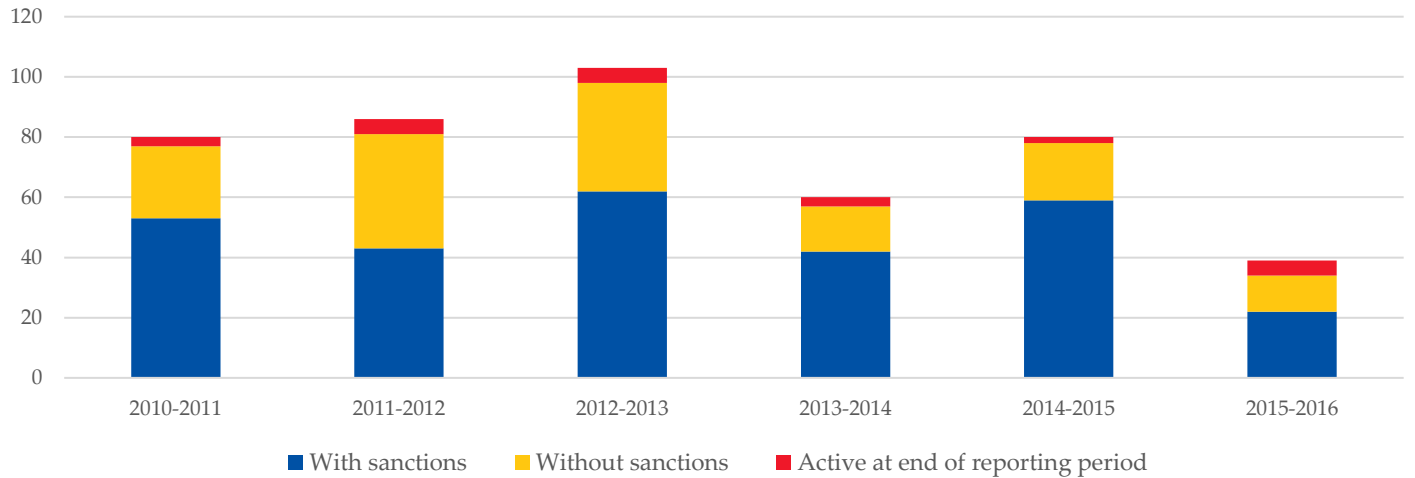

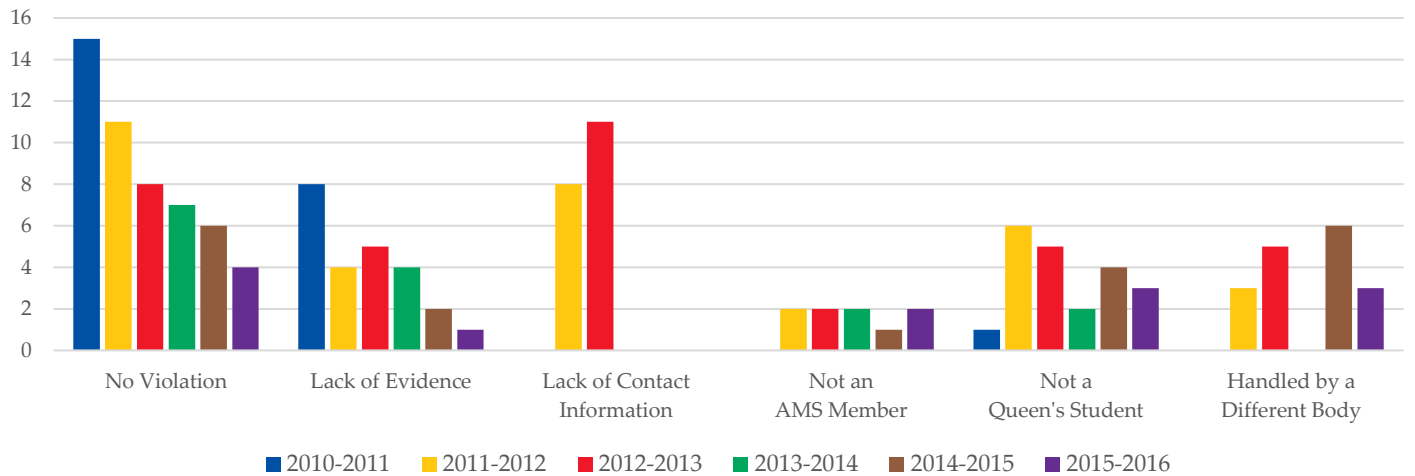

<sup>vii</sup> Average number of days elapsed from the opening of a case until completion of sanctions (for those cases which involved sanctions).

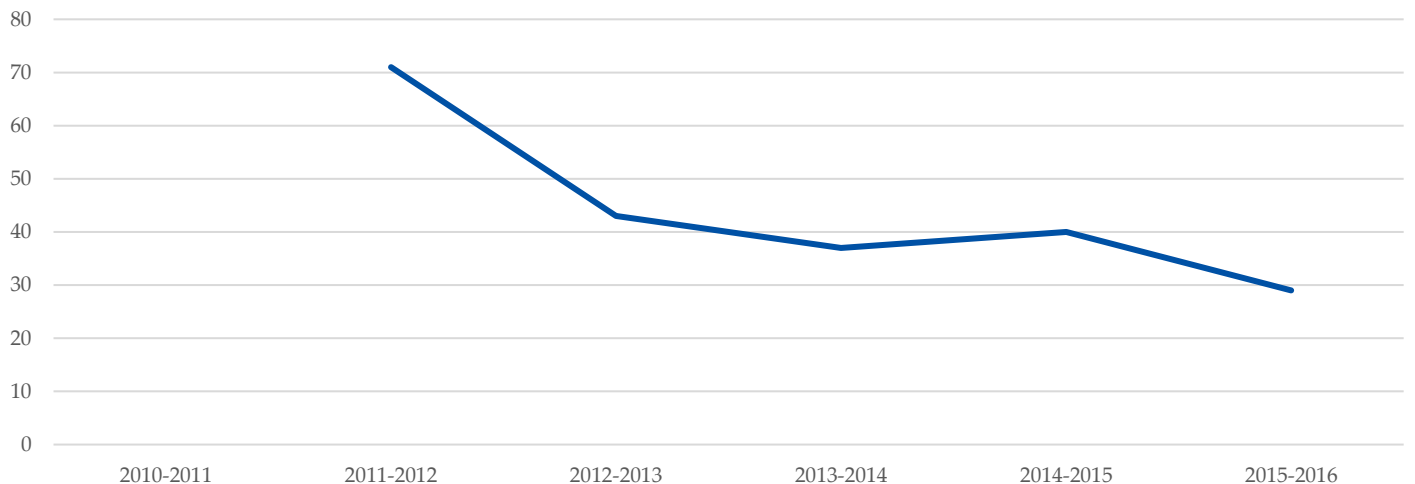
## Overall Case Breakdown



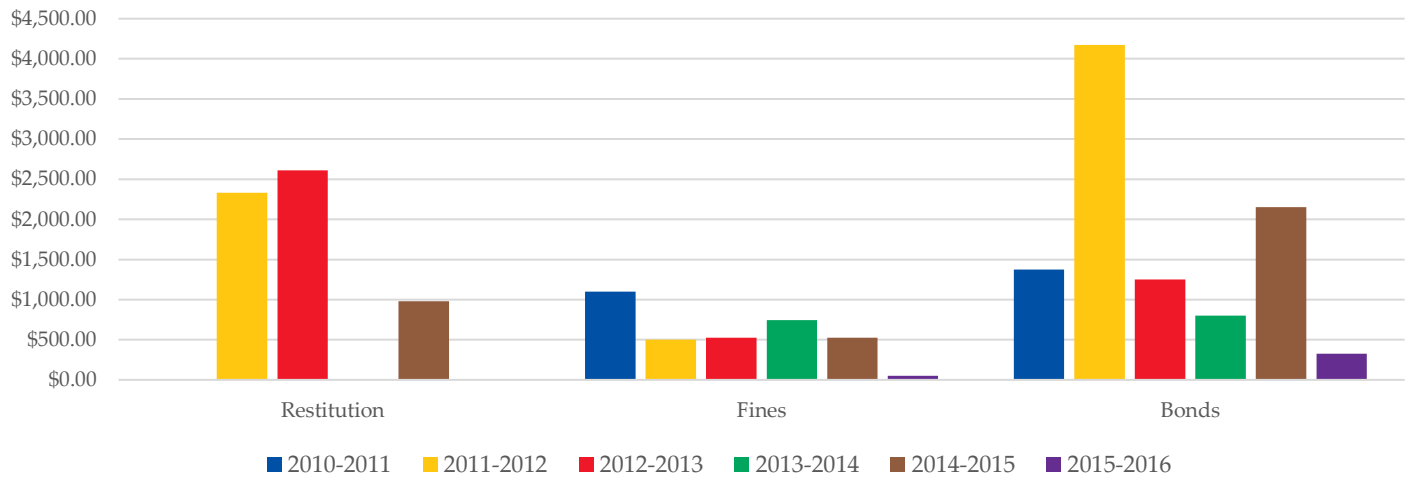
## Cases with No Sanctions



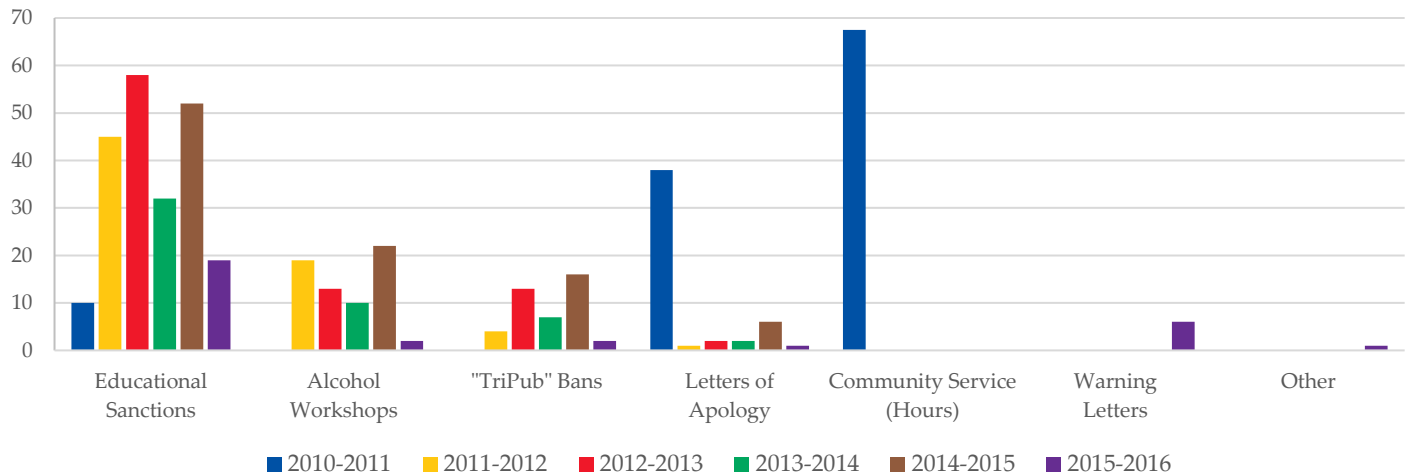
## Average Time (Days) to Sanctioning

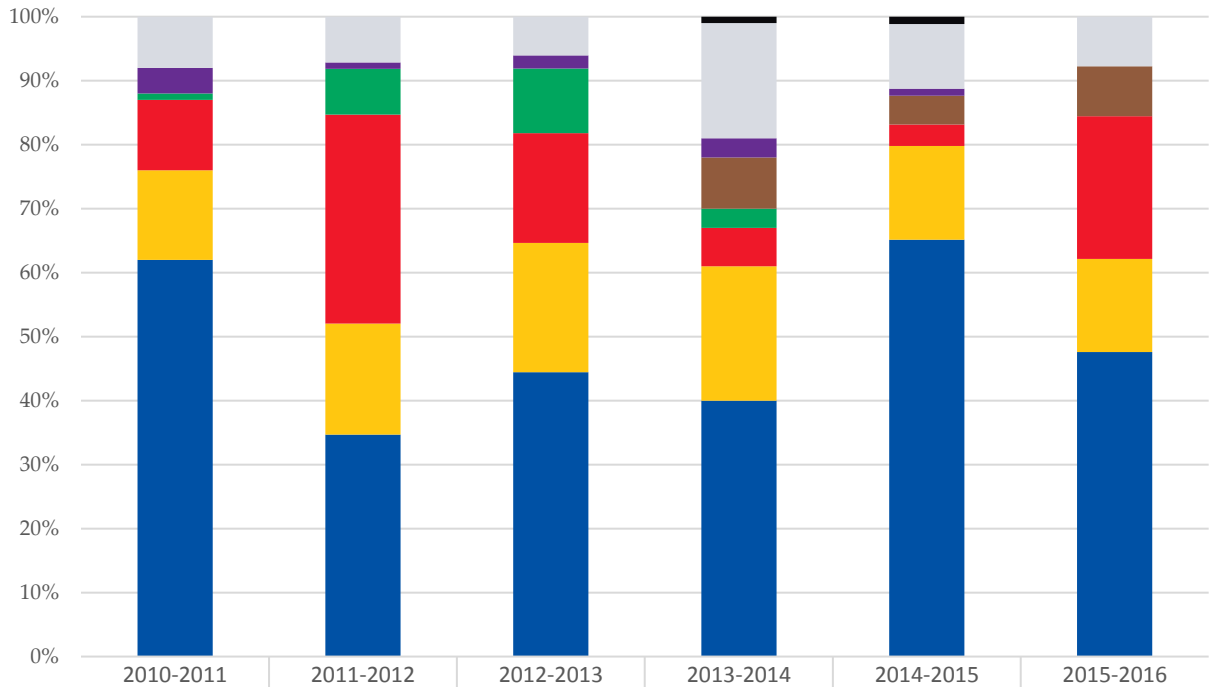


## Non-Monetary Sanctions <sup>viii</sup>



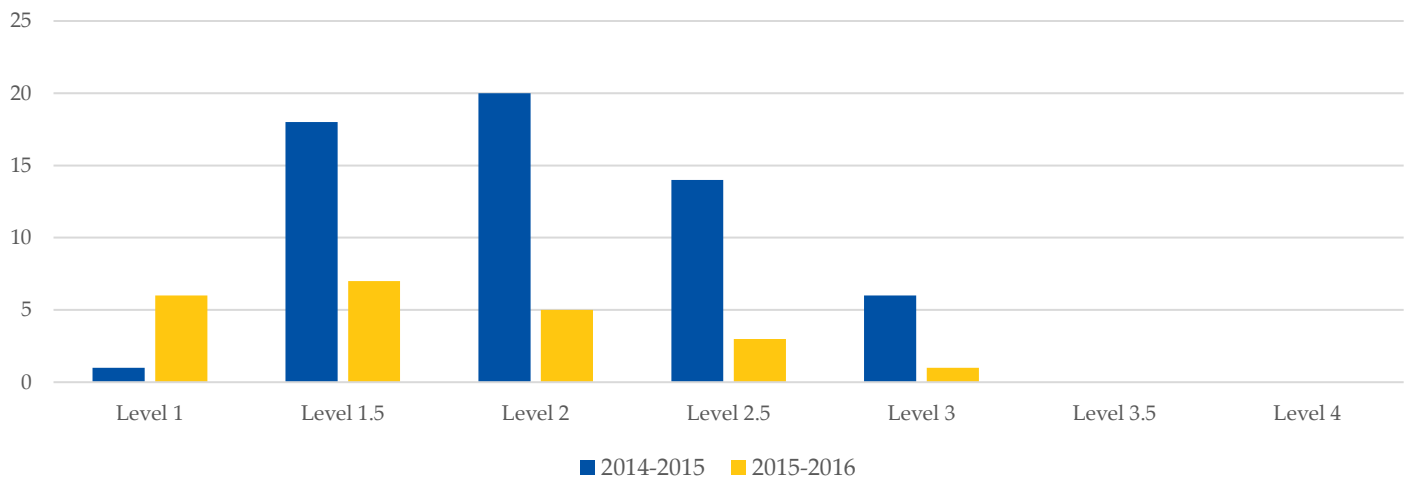

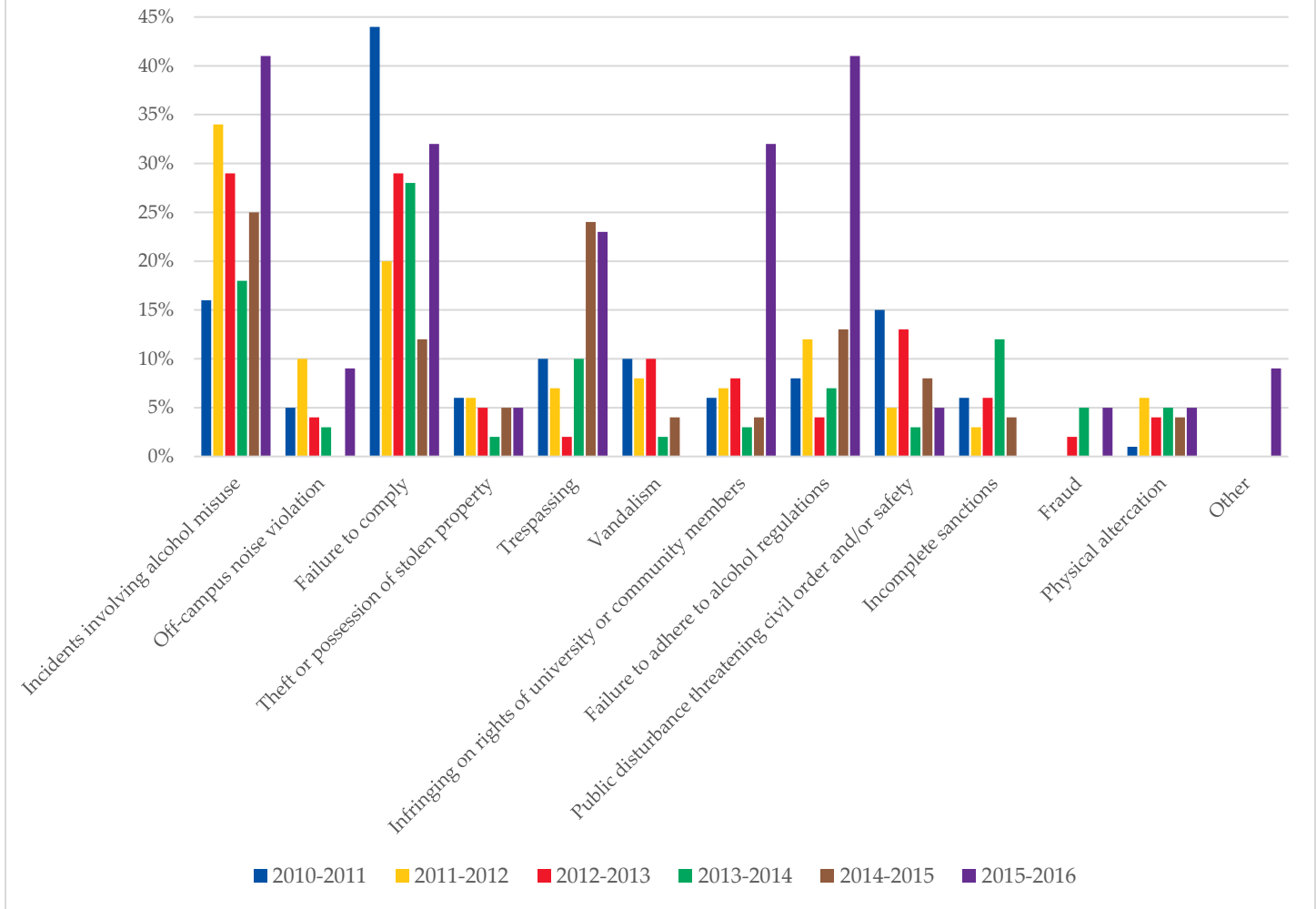

In 2015-2016, this consisted of two cases of smoking inside a campus building.
